Priority of Access & Potential Subsidies

All course places on UKCC Level 1 and 2 courses will be prioritised as follows (1 receiving the highest priority of access):

- 2 Primary Affiliated Clubs with a Junior Section within Worcestershire
- 3 Primary Affiliated Clubs
- 4 Secondary Affiliated Clubs (Clubs from geographical bordering counties)

Following completion and successful examination on UKCC Level 1, Level 2 & Club Coach Award courses candidates from Focus Clubs and Affiliated Clubs with a Junior Section may qualify for an ECB subsidy. All subsidies distributed shall be paid directly to the candidates' cricket club upon successful qualification.

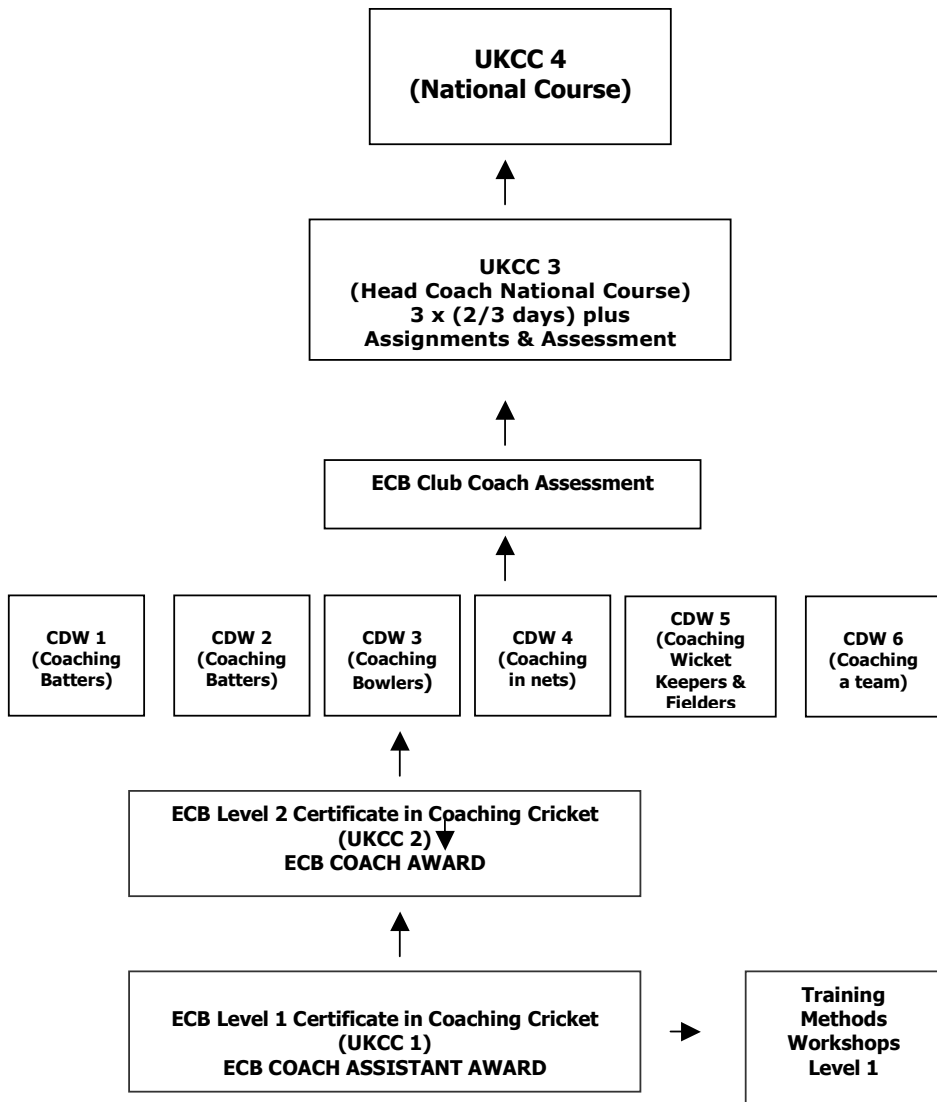

ECB CLUB COACH AWARD

The ECB Club Coach qualification is designed for coaches working in club and school environments who have access and responsibility for the development of players in addition to improving and driving forward their coaching skills. The prerequisites for coaches wishing to attend a Club Coach Assessment Day are:

1. An ECB Coach (UKCC2) qualification or an ECB Level 2 qualification (pre 2005)
2. Attendance at all 6 Development Workshops*

* Existing 'old style' ECB Level 2 coaches wishing to do the Club Coach qualification do not have to attend all of the CDW's, however, it is highly recommended that they do so as a way of preparing for the assessment which is focused on the skills and knowledge within the 6 CDWs)

- ECB Coaches Association Membership
- An ECB CRB clearance
- A current GPCP / Safeguarding & Protecting Children certificate
- A current and recognised First Aid qualification

NB: This qualification is mandatory for any coach wishing to continue on to the UKCC Level 3 Award Course

Qualification Details:

The assessment will be based upon information delivered in the Coach Development Workshops and a Club Coach Information Booklet containing additional information specific to the Club Coach role which will be sent to coaches before their assessment day. Coaches will be assessed on their ability to observe and analyse players through video analysis. They will also be assessed on how well they are able to work with a small group of players on tactical development in a net situation.

During this net session, they will be assessed on their ability to apply information shared through the workshops. This includes communication skills and the ability to observe and analyse player performance in practice scenarios.

Level 1 Certificate in Coaching Cricket

ECB Coaching Assistant

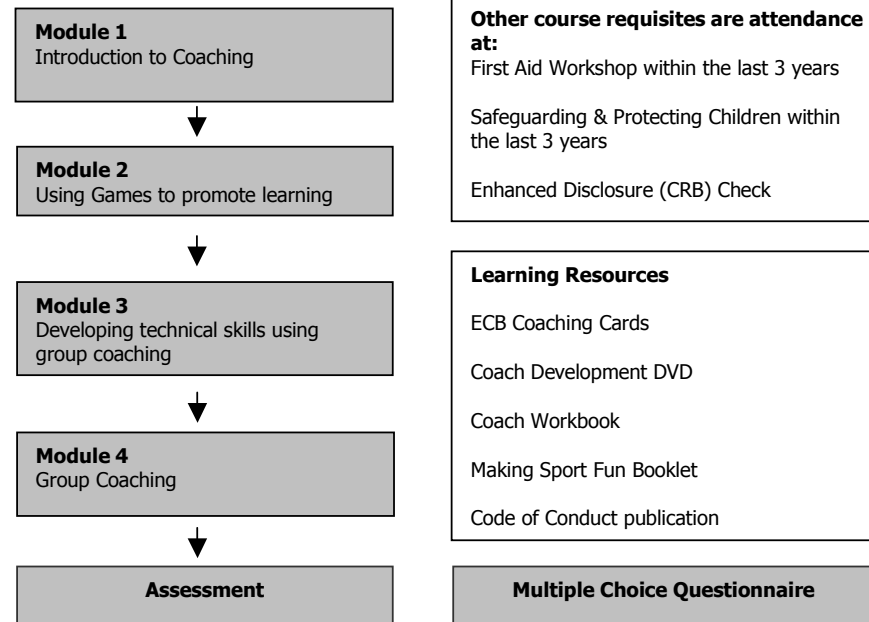
The Level 1 Certificate in Coaching Cricket is aimed at beginner coaches. Once competent the newly qualified coach will be able to 'assist more qualified coaches, delivering aspects of coaching sessions, normally under direct supervision'. This role may include running warm ups, cool downs, small sided games and small group work. The course is essentially designed for parents and volunteers starting out on the coaching pathway and will help coaches prepare for, deliver and review cricket coaching sessions. Candidates must be 16 years of age at the commencement of the course.

The course will enable candidates to;

- introduce and develop the game of cricket to people of all ages in a safe and enjoyable way
- develop and improve players (as people as well as cricketers)
- develop coaching skills, knowledge and qualities
- demonstrate competence against UKCC/National standards for coaches

The programme consists of 4 x 3 hour modules and a final assessment and is outlined below:

CDW 5 - Coaching a team

This workshop introduces the concept of coaching a team on match day. There is a session on the pre-match preparation for players at different stages of development. Coaches discuss the role of the coach during the match itself and focus on the implications of their behaviour on their players. The workshop provides an insight into how to plan pre-match and post match activities. There is an opportunity to run some specific pre-match warm up games. The second half concentrates upon some of the training methods that coaches can use with an emphasis on how to develop small-sided games as well as how to plan training nights for large groups of players.

CDW 6 - Working in nets

Working in the nets remains a favoured coaching method at many clubs and schools. This workshop gives coaches the chance to share their previous experiences of managing net sessions and develops coaches understanding of the skills associated with effective net coaching. Different ways of using the nets are covered and there is a session on how coaches can use bowling machines effectively with players. Coaches have the chance to have a go at coaching in net situations.

In addition and to assist UKCC Level 1 coaches with net management and supervision (under direct supervision from a more qualified coach) the following additional workshop has been introduced.

ADDITIONAL COACH DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS

TM - Training Methods Workshop (for Level 1's)

This 3 hour workshop has been designed to help coaching assistants manage (under direct supervision from a more qualified coach) players within a net environment. It will also enable coaching assistants to consider when players would benefit from working in the nets as well as providing alternative training activities. After completing the course Coaching Assistants may wish to consider attending the ECB Coach Course (UKCC2). The course will enable coaching assistants to:

- manage a net (under direct supervision from a more qualified coach)
- understand the advantages and disadvantages of working in a net environment
- run alternative activities in a net environment
- introduce, run and adapt a cricket circuit
- introduce, run and adapt Pairs cricket

**ECB COACH AWARD
(UKCC Level 2)**

The ECB Coaching Course leading to the 1st 4Sport Level 2 certificate in Cricket Coaching (ECB Coach Award) is the second level of the nationally recognised United Kingdom Coaching Certificate (UKCC).

Candidates must be 18 years of age before the commencement of the course.

On successful completion coaches will be able to prepare, deliver and review coaching sessions. The course consists of 8 x 3 hour modules which will enable candidates to:

- Introduce and develop the game of cricket to people of all ages in a fun and enjoyable way
- Develop fundamental movement skills
- Develop and improve players (as people as well as cricketers)
- Develop coaching skills, knowledge and qualities
- Demonstrate competence against UKCC Level 2 national standards for coaches

To fulfill course requirements candidates will:

- be required to have attended a First Aid course and a Safeguarding and Protecting Children workshop within the previous 3 years and will be required to submit their certificate of attendance to course tutors.
- Complete a minimum of 6 sessions supported practice 'in the field' and submit a record of these sessions prior to the practical assessment
- Complete 4 home assignments prior to the practical assessment

This is a demanding programme and is only suitable as an entry point on to the coach education syllabus for candidates with good experience of playing cricket or with highly developed teaching or coaching skills. **For this reason candidates will be vetted by the WCCA Internal verifier and places allocated according to experience gained (as detailed on course application form)**

COACH DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS

Coach Development Workshops are aimed at coaches who have attended the new UKCC2 course or the previous ECB Level 2 qualification. These workshops are designed to act as 'stepping stones' for individuals who wish to work towards attending either the Club Coach Course or the UKCC Level 3 National Course. Coaches can also access these workshops as CPD (Continual Professional Development). An ECB certificate of attendance will be issued for each workshop attended where the following requirements are met; (1) ECB CA Member (2) Current (within the past 3 years) CRB clearance, First Aid, Safeguarding & Protecting Children certificate. A descriptor is as follows:

CDW 1 - Developing Batters

The aim of this workshop is to develop coaches understanding of a wider range of batting shots as well as building upon key observation and skills analysis. There is a reinforcement of the key batting stages identified at UKCC 2 and the tutor introduces the concept of pre-delivery movements. Coaches are then given the opportunity to work in small groups whilst the tutor introduces key batting skills. All will experience the role of the coach at some stage and the tutor will base reviews upon communication skills (asking effective questions) and technical knowledge (accuracy of demonstrations, appropriate coaching points and intervention strategies).

CDW 2 - Using video when working with batters

This workshop concentrates upon practical guidelines for using video cameras when working with batters. It focuses upon which camera angles to use and how to use information effectively with players. This session allows tutors to reinforce some of the key technical information from UKCC 2 by giving the coaches a chance to practice their observation and analysis through video analysis. Coaches have to identify strengths and weaknesses according to these observations and identify how they could go about correcting some of the faults. The final section of the workshop allows coaches the opportunity to discuss key tactical considerations when working with batters. There is a chance to observe some footage of a player and discuss the ways in which coaches can develop training methods to work on a tactical basis

CDW 3 - Working with wicket keepers and fielders

This workshop allows coaches the opportunity to coach wicketkeepers and fielders. They are given an opportunity to practice their coaching skills working with peers on wicket-keeping with new drills being introduced for them to develop and use. Tutors draw out some of the recommendations for making these drills effective and further work is based upon specialist fielding techniques ranging from slip catching technique to specialist retrieval methods. Coaches have the opportunity to devise specific drills associated with these techniques.

CDW 4 - Working with bowlers and using video cameras

This workshop concentrates upon practical guidelines for using video cameras when working with bowlers. It focuses upon which camera angles to use and how to use information effectively with players. This session allows tutors to reinforce some of the key technical information from ECB Coach course by giving the coaches a chance to practice their observation and analysis through video analysis. Coaches have to identify strengths and weaknesses according to these observations and identify how they could go about correcting some of the faults. There is a chance to observe a pace bowler and a spinner. Coaches are introduced to some drills that could be used to develop their bowler's technique and there is a section on specific variations associated with pace and spin. Post course reading allows the coaches the chance to devise field placings and game plans for different bowlers.
